LSU signed the funding certification and agreement for the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on April 13, 2020 and plans to use the funds to provide the mandated amount of at least 50% of the emergency financial aid grants to students.

- LSU will receive \$9,441,144 (50%) of the total Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) dollars allocated to the university for emergency student aid.
- As of December 31, 2020, \$9,307,950 has been distributed to students.
- Approximately 18,276 students are eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant.
- As of December 31, 2020, 18,276 students have received an emergency financial aid grant.
- All eligible students were awarded CARES Act funding. Award amounts ranged from \$150 - \$1,000 depending on enrollment status and financial need.

No change from September 30, 2020 report.

Eligible students are defined as:

- Enrolled in an eligible program at least half time
- A U.S. Citizen or eligible noncitizen
- With a Valid 2019-2020 FAFSA on file
- Maintaining satisfactory academic progress
- Not in default or owe an overpayment on a Title IV grant or loan
- Having documents on file verifying the student's identity, a statement of educational purpose, selective service registration, birth certificate and social security number

The language of the law specifically prohibits the following types of students from receiving the emergency grants:

- International and undocumented students
- Dual enrollment students
- Students enrolled through LSU Online
