

LSU MANDATORY REPORTER GUIDE



Monitor employees* including graduate assistants, teaching assistants, and evidence assistants are required to report in accordance of the alumni conduct. Title IX coordinator.

1. Listen and provide support

When you receive a report of alleged sexual harassment or sexual assault, listen to the reporter and provide support. Do not investigate or attempt to resolve the incident. Do not discuss the incident with anyone else.

2. Refer to supportive resources, such as:

LSU's Title IX coordinator, the Title IX office, the LSU Mobile app, or the LSU Ombuds Office. You can also refer the reporter to the LSU Ombuds Office, the LSU Office of Student Conduct, or the LSU Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs.

3. Report the incident to the Title IX coordinator

4. What happens after I report?

After you report an incident, the Title IX coordinator will investigate the incident and determine if there is a violation of the LSU Title IX Policy. The Title IX coordinator will also provide support to the reporter and the alleged victim. The Title IX coordinator will also provide support to the alleged perpetrator.
