- Course Work: the Degee Audit must include the required number of hours listed according the departmental requirements, but hay not list excess hours taken. The department reserves the right to determine of courses with respect the age of the courses and applicability to current degree requirements.
- Undergraduate Courses may not be listed. This includes epartmental prerequisites areaquired English and/or foreign language requirements.
- Courses from Other Institutions mustbe listed as they appear the official transcript:
