<u>Innovative Teaching</u>

Pediatric Psychology, Baton Rouge Clinic

For the past several years, I developed and administered a psychology consultative service at the Baton Rouge Clinic, the largest outpatient clinic in Baton Rouge, LA. The BR Clinic has 15 pediatricians and a variety of pediatric specialists including endocrinologists and neurologists. Under my supervision, graduate students in the doctoral programs of School and Clinical Psychology work collaboratively with physicians and other health care providers in the assessment and treatment of children's physical, academic, behavioral, and emotional problems. Students conduct individual and group treatment, as well as parent training and consultation with local schools. Commonly treaded problems include: ADHD, Major Depression, Social Phobia and other anxiety disorders, Asperger's Syndrome, Oppositional Defiant Disorder, Learning Disabilities, and physical problems with behavioral component. We are integrally involved varied health care providers in the collaborative assessment and treatment of children with diabetes and other endocrine disorders and obesity. Paid interns administer a multi-disciplinary pediatric obesity treatment problem, Kids on the Geaux.

Clinical Psychology Practicum with LSU Medical Center, Pediatrics Department, Earl K. Long Hospital

From 1982 thru 2004 I developed and administered a psychology consultative service in the Department of Pediatrics at Earl K. Long Hospital. My duties included

supervising the clinical work of approximately eight psychology graduate students who as a group are responsible for treating approximately 40-50 children with behavior problems. Essentially, our consultative service is responsible for all psychological services provided within the pediatric department.

As director of the consultative service, I devoted a great deal of time to developing professional relationships with the Pediatric Department faculty and in training the pediatric residents. For example, my students and I have given numerous lectures to the residents and faculty, conduct a behavioral pediatrics clinic which is a formal component of the outpatient clinic services offered by the Pediatrics Department and is attended by medical students.

Because our service is a viable component of the Pediatrics Department, I was required to supervise the work of our students and be available to the residents on a 12 month basis. My involvement at EKL has occurred irrespective of vacations normally available to a faculty member in between semesters and during spring break. We currently are very active conducting assessments of high risk neonates, infants, and children. We also provide psychological services to pediatric AIDS patients and other high risk, chronically or acutely ill children.

Child Behavior Therapy

I have developed this course, which is a required course for all Ph.D. candidates in our School Psychology and Child Clinical Psychology programs. My emphasis has been to teach the students to critically evaluate the child behavior therapy literature and to acquire skills in the assessment and treatment of children's behavior problems.
