To get a , you need to take WGS 7150, 7900 and 6 hours of approved 4000/7000 level courses.

Contemporary feminist theory maintains a remarkably lively critical engagement with the work of French philosopher Michel Foucault. While not explicitly a feminist (Foucault makes few references to women or gender in his work), feminist philosophers have found his exploration of the relations between power, the body and sexuality particularly

on women and crime. This is highly appropriate, since most Criminological research and theory are devoted to male

women. This course will be a combination of these two imperatives, then sometimes focusing more heavily on female offenders and victims who have been relegated to the sidelines of criminology and sometimes focusing on theoretical challenges that the gender gap in offending raises.
