

POLICY STATEMENT3 TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS FOR NONFACULTY PERSONNEL

POLICY DIGEST

Monitoring Unit: Office of Academic Affairs Initially Issued: August 22, 1977

I. PURPOSE

To define circumstances under which non-faculty employees of the University may teach courses for credit.

II. DEFINITIONS

Non-faculty employees of the University are all those employees who are not specifically named to the faculty ranks of Instructor or above or equivalent as defined in the By-Laws and Regulationsof the Board of Supervisors.

III. GENERAL POLICY

Teaching assignments for University employees who do not hold faculty appointments will be approved only for persons who can qualify for appointment as part-time Instructor or above. The teaching appointment should be effected by adding the following to the employee's current job title:

ppropriate if the teaching assignment falls outside the employee's ne appointment shall be without additional compensation and cross-tment involved. A teaching assignment falling within the employee's s, be approved by appropriate supervisors. An employee who teaches alar duties may teach no more than one class persemester.
