LSU WAR MEMORIAL COMMISSION

Memorial Commission (Phase I) project was completed with the dedication of the World War Memorial Plaza on October 8, 1998 in memory of those LSU alumni, faculty, staff and students who served while serving honorably in the Armed Forces of our country during America's wars of the 20th century since World War I.

The LSU War Memorial Commission began Phase II plans with the designation of the Commission as the primary successor occupant of the Memorial Tower when vacated by the LSU Museum of Art.

As the primary successor of the Memorial Tower, the LSU War Memorial Commission (Phase I) assumes the responsibility for developing an appropriate design for the purpose of providing suitable facilities for the military museum, archival repository, computerized database (kiosk), wall of honor, exhibits and other appropriate recognition to honor the men and women from LSU who served honorably in the Armed Forces of our country.

The Commission shall consist of at least fifteen (15) members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors, including three (3) ex officio members. Appointees shall be selected from the

- a. President & CEO, LSU Alumni Association
- b. Member of Alumni Association Staff
- c. Commander, American Legion Boyd Ewing Post 58
- d. Associate Vice President, Facility & Property Oversight
- e. Vice President, Strategic Communications
- f. Executive Director, LSU Museum of Art
- g. President, Cadets of the Ole War Skule
- h. Commandant of Cadets, LSU ROTC
- i. Professor, Department of History

subject to approval by the President.

b. Other officers, i.e., committee chairmen, shall be appointed by
