As awareness of this situation has incredased been contacted by are understandably concerned about the possibility of repercussion may be alleged to be political as they teach their classes. In discuadministration about these concerns they confirmed their commitmental policies on academic freedom and speech, increding Academic Freedom.

I appreciate the tension many feel around this subject and share their concerns. At this time the best advice I can provide, based on the numerous discussions I have had on this topic with the current administration, is to teach your courses guided by your best professional judgment about what constitutes appropriate content and methods for your field. The restriction teaching contentious material or topics which may be understood as political so long as the material is germane to the course and, to quote from the syderenced earlier, instructors refrain "from insisting upon the adoption by students or others of any particular pieintast authoritative in controversial issues." Furthermore, do your bestoid introducing material which is not relevant to the course as recommended by the American Association of University Professor's 1940
